SUMMER 1: Youth Design Academy

- includes 3-day-a-week course in Design Fundamentals at Massachusetts College of Art and Design students receive both high school elective credits AND 3 college credits
- interaction with advanced Youth Designers and creative professionals at collaborative workshops, art museum visits, tours of top creative firms, job shadows, etc.

SUMMER 2: Youth Design Workplace Jobs

- each Youth Designer works in a full-time design industry job alongside professional designers who serve as mentors
- jobs include graphic design, industrial design, web design, architecture, marketing design, and fashion; in design studios, multidisciplinary branding/design firms, non-profits, etc.

School-Year Activities

- required workshops preparing students for fulltime summer jobs, including training in professional computer design software applications
- required workshops preparing students for college selection/application process
- academic support / college application support
- support for art/design portfolio development
- continued design skill building and exposure to myriad aspects of the design profession
- real-world design and community art projects
- life skills including financial literacy, nutrition
- cultural activities including attending theatrical performances, art/design community events
